I am pleased to announce that we have completed our annual Ministry of Health Inspection of Long Term Care Homes. I want to take this opportunity to thank everyone including staff, residents and family members for your patience and continued support during this process. Our final report was very positive and the inspectors conveyed to us that we have a wonderful home and staff. Our Convalescent Care Program is advancing and moving along as planned. A story was recently published in the Niagara Advance about the program and its progress. So far we have had a total of 14 individuals admitted into Convalescent Care and discharged home. Nine of those admissions have been Niagara on the Lake residents. Our goals remain the same and we hope to have 12 beds for convalescent care within a year. Our Director of Care, Bonita Riehl continues to be on a medical leave and she is recuperating well. During her absence I will continue to be your Acting Director of Care along with my role of Convalescent Care Coordinator.
