Flower of the Month – Aster

September's flower is the late-blooming aster, considered the afterthought of the Roman goddess Flora because it blooms later in the season than most flowers. These mid- to late-summer blooms get their name from aster, the Greek word for "star," and have even picked up the nickname of the "Christmas Daisy." There are around 180 species of aster, many found in North America. It comes in a variety of colors—including pink, purple, lavender, blue, and red—usually with a yellow center but sometimes centered in black. It's a perennial, blooming year after year following a first year of dormancy. So, in the language of flowers, the aster has come to symbolize daintiness, love, and patience.
